Prior to this, Valerie served as Associate Head of Major Gifts and Head of Partnership Funding at King's College London, where she led the major gifts fundraising team in securing major gifts from a variety of constituent groups and building effective relationships with key external and internal stakeholders. Prior to King's College, Valerie was Head of Fundraising and Membership at Horniman Museum and Gardens in London, where she was responsible for recruiting a high-performing fundraising team, developing a comprehensive fundraising and membership strategy focused on key revenue streams, and creating a strategic approach to soliciting a wide range of donors— including visitors, members, foundations, high net worth individuals, and private businesses. Due to her campaign management and implementation efforts, Valerie secured £3.7 million against the Museum's £4.6 million goal during her tenure.

Valerie has contributed her fundraising, relationship building, and communications expertise to a number of other fundraising efforts based in London, holding the positions of Director of Fundraising for Oval House; Senior Development Manager for the Geffrye Museum; and Public Relations and Community Relations Manager at Ace of Clubs, Homeless Charity. Before moving to London, she held communications and development positions in Paris, serving as Public Relations and Communications Senior Manager for EDF (Electricité de France) and Development Manager at Musée du Louvre in Paris.

Along with professional work in the field, Valerie maintains a number of voluntary engagements including

membership and speaking engagements with CASE Europe (Council for Advancement and Support of Education) and consulting work for the Refugees and Arts Initiative in London. She is also a visiting lecturer at Université Cergy and South Bank University where she teaches fundraising for the arts and sponsorship and funding in France and the UK.

Valerie holds an MA in Communication Management from London Guildhall University, an MA in Communication and Human Resources from Sciences Po in Paris, an MA in Medieval History from University Paris X – Nanterre, and a BA in History from Lycée Lakanal - University Paris X – Nanterre.
